Marquette County “Fun Facts”

- Marquette County is north of about 92% of the population of the United States. Seattle is the largest U.S. city north of Marquette.
- No matter where you are in Marquette County, you are north of where most Canadians live. Over 54 per cent of the population of Canada lives south of us, including the cities of Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal and Halifax.
- At 1,808 square miles, Marquette County is the largest county by land area in Michigan. This makes it a little larger than the state of Rhode Island, but a little smaller than the state of Delaware. Marquette County is the 15th largest county east of the Mississippi River. Minnesota, Maine and Florida all have larger counties.
- When Marquette County was first formed in 1843, it included the Keweenaw Peninsula. What is now Skandia Township was part of Schoolcraft County. Marquette County’s current boundary was set in 1891.
- The highest and lowest elevations in Michigan are in Marquette County. The bottom of the Empire Mine pit is 301 feet above sea level (268 feet below the surface of Lake Erie, the natural lowest point in Michigan). The top of the waste rock pile for the Tilden Mine was 2017 feet above sea level in 2015, making it 38 feet higher than Mount Arvon, the highest natural point in Michigan.

QUALIFICATIONS TO BECOME A REGISTERED VOTER

- A U.S. citizen;
- At least 18 years of age by election day;
- A resident of Michigan and the city or township where you are applying to register to vote at least 30 days before the election.

You may:

1. Register in person with appropriate City or Township Clerk, Secretary of State Office, or County Clerk;
2. A mail-in voter registration form can be obtained by contacting your local clerk's office;
3. Michigan voters must use the same address for voter registration and driver license purposes.
